

Wembley Temple - GUIDELINES FOR YOUR VISIT

The Mandir is a sacred House of God. To preserve its dignity and sanctity, all visitors are required to abide by the following rules and regulations applicable in all areas.

DRESS CODE

Please note that a strict dress code operates within the Complex. Specifically, no shorts and no bare shoulders (i.e. shorts must be below knee length; shoulders must be covered).

SHOES

It is customary to remove footwear upon entering the Mandir. Shoe racks are provided within the Complex in the basement.

VIDEO & PHOTOGRAPHY

Videos and photos – **for personal use only** – may be taken from ground level outside of the Mandir only. NO video or photography is allowed inside or on the front steps at all. Any professional use by wedding photographers is chargeable and must be cleared and paid for in advance on the day.

PARKING

There is parking facility for cars. Charges are £2 per hour, payable on entry. There is a limited free car park facility only for the disabled blue badge holders. Parking facility is also available for mini buses & coaches – charges are £3 per hour and £5 per hour respectively and must be booked in advance with our Office.

SMOKING

Smoking is not allowed anywhere on the premises, including the Temple grounds.

FOOD & DRINK

No food or drink is allowed in the mandir. Please discard chewing gum prior to entering.

MOBILE PHONES

Please switch off your mobile phones prior to entering the mandir. Any mobile phones with cameras must not be used to take photos or video footage inside the mandir.

SECURITY

All bags and cameras should be left in the Security Baggage Cabin in the car park prior to entering the mandir. Remember to collect your belongings when you leave. Please respect all security procedures in place for the safety of all visitors. Sharp and dangerous objects are not allowed inside the mandir.

CONDUCT

Please refrain from touching the delicate carvings. To maintain the spiritual atmosphere, please observe silence inside the sanctum.

DISABLED ACCESS

A ramp for wheelchair access is available at the back entrance of the mandir. Wheelchairs will be provided subject to availability. Shoe racks are available at the rear entrance for shoes to be stored.

PLEASE NOTE

For the benefit of all visitors and worshippers, the Temple Management reserves the right to refuse admission to those who do not comply with the guidelines set out above. The Management also reserves the right to cancel or alter any visit, or close any part of the premises without prior notice. Every reasonable effort will be made to avoid any undue inconvenience.
